

**Representative Don Beyer (D-VA)**

Committees: Ways and Means; Joint Economic Committee

Representative Don Beyer is serving his fifth term representing Virginia's 8th Congressional District, which includes Arlington, Alexandria, Falls Church, and parts of Fairfax County.

Rep. Beyer serves on the House Committee on Ways and Means and the Joint Economic Committee, where he focuses on promoting sustainable growth, fair tax policy, and fiscal responsibility.

Before his election to Congress in 2014, Beyer served as Virginia's Lieutenant Governor from 1990 to 1998. He also served as U.S. Ambassador to Switzerland and Liechtenstein under President Obama. As Ambassador, he played a key role in advancing U.S. sanctions policy toward Iran and strengthening financial transparency between the U.S. and Switzerland.

Rep. Beyer has been deeply involved in education, workforce, and economic development initiatives—chairing Jobs for Virginia Graduates, co-founding the Northern Virginia Technology Council, and leading the Virginia Economic Recovery Commission.

**Representative Bill Huizenga (R-MI)**

Vice Chair, House Financial Services Committee  
Committees: House Financial Services; Foreign Affairs

Representative Bill Huizenga has served as a U.S. representative since 2011 and currently represents Michigan's 4th Congressional District. Rep. Huizenga is a member of the influential House Financial Services Committee, where he serves Vice Chair, and also sits on the House Foreign Affairs Committee.

As House Financial Services Vice Chair, Rep. Huizenga's extensive experience across the committee's jurisdiction drives policy initiatives pertaining to economic growth and stabilization; domestic monetary policy and interest rates; the allocation of credit; and the structure and functioning of domestic financial institutions. Federal agencies under the oversight of the House Financial Services Committee include the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC), the Consumer Financial Protection Bureau (CFPB), the Federal Reserve, the Department of Treasury, and the Government Sponsored Enterprises (Fannie Mae & Freddie Mac).

Rep. Huizenga is an original member of the Bipartisan Fiscal Forum (BFF), a group founded during the 118th Congress that is dedicated to sounding the alarm about our nation's unsustainable debt trajectory and working together to get control of our fiscal future. He serves as the Republican Co-Chair, working with the group's members to elevate the debt issue while providing members with opportunities to improve the fiscal policy debate in Congress.

Rep. Huizenga has previously served on each of the House Financial Services Subcommittees, including Housing, Community Development, and Insurance; Investor Protection, Entrepreneurship, and Capital Markets; and Monetary Policy and Trade. During the 118th Congress, Rep. Huizenga served as the Chairman of the Oversight and Investigations Subcommittee, where he oversaw all agencies, departments, programs, and matters within the Financial Services Committee's jurisdiction.

Prior to being elected to Congress, Rep. Huizenga served in the Michigan House of Representatives from 2003 to 2009.

Rep. Huizenga began his career as a realtor and entrepreneur. Today, he co-owns Huizenga Gravel Inc. located in Jenison, MI.

**Representative Tim Kennedy (D-NY)**

Committees: Homeland Security; Veterans Affairs

Rep. Kennedy serves New York's 26th District and is a member of the House Committee on Homeland Security, where he serves as Ranking Member on the Subcommittee on Emergency Management and Technology and as a member of the Subcommittee on Transportation and Maritime Security. Kennedy is also a member of the House Committee on Veterans Affairs, including its

Subcommittees on Technology Modernization and Oversight and Investigations.

Rep. Kennedy previously served in the Erie County Legislature and New York State Senate, first winning election to the State Senate in 2010. He served in the State Senate from 2010-2024. During his time in the State Senate, he helped pass bills to combat the opioid epidemic in New York and worked to expand abortion rights, raise the minimum wage and legalize marriage equality. Prior to his time in public office, he worked as a licensed occupational therapist at Catholic Health.

In a 2024 special election, he was elected to represent New York's 26th District and was sworn in on May 6, 2024.

**Representative Beth Van Duyne (R-TX)**

Committees: Ways and Means; Small Business

Representative Beth Van Duyne represents Texas's 24th Congressional District, covering portions of Dallas and Tarrant counties in the heart of the Dallas–Fort Worth region. She is one of only two Republican women from Texas ever elected to the U.S. House of Representatives.

She serves on the House Ways and Means Subcommittees on Taxation, Trade, Oversight, and Work and Welfare, where she focuses on pro-growth policies to help individuals keep more of what they earn, strengthen American competitiveness, and ensure accountability in federal programs.

In the 119th Congress, she chairs the House Small Business Subcommittee on Economic Growth, Tax, and Capital Access, leading efforts to expand access to capital and encourage workforce participation. She previously chaired the Small Business Subcommittee on Oversight, where she investigated pandemic-related fraud and promoted policies to strengthen U.S. small businesses.

Before her election to Congress, Van Duyne served as Regional Administrator for the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development under Secretary Ben Carson, overseeing operations across five states and leading recovery efforts after Hurricane Harvey.

She also served as Mayor of Irving—the first woman elected to the role—where she helped attract \$3 billion in new development and 40,000 jobs. Van Duyne began her career in business consulting.
